As a College, we provide specialist support for people with learning difficulties and physical difficulties, to enable all students to access mainstream education. We also provide tailor-made support packages, which allow students to work at their own pace and reach their full potential.

Assessments are carried out by qualified assessors following national guidelines. which identify strengths and areas of difficulty type of support to meet their needs. The assessor may also recommend exam access arrangements; such as extra time, a reader or a scribe to help in exams or alternatively will recommend interventions and support to help the student with their learning.

COUNSELLING

We have a team of qualified counsellors at College, who are available if you feel the need to talk in confidence about any issues that are worrying you. All our counsellors are registered members of the British Association of Counsellors and Psychotherapy (BACP) and abide by their ethical framework. Counsellors aren't there to tell you what to do or give you advice, but will work with you to help you better understand yourself and the problems you are facing. Our counsellors are trained in Person Centred Therapy but work in an interrogative way offering different approaches to therapy that suits you best.

HEALTH & WELLBEING

The Health and Wellbeing team are here to support students struggling with any aspect of their life. They offer practical advice and guidance and will signpost you to various internal and external services if appropriate. The team can suggest a range of practical resources to support your emotional needs, with signposts including mental health organisations, NHS-Approved apps and worksheets, as well as advice on things like balancing workloads, healthy eating, exercise and getting a good night's sleep.

You can refer yourself to either service or you can ask your Achievement Tutor to refer you.


RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

We believe that the study of RE is central to each student's experience at Cardinal Newman. As part of your programme of study at Newman, you will attend one 50-minute session per week of RE, but it is not RE as you know it!

RE is all about challenging and encouraging you to question and evaluate who you are, what you believe, your role in society and what others believe and why. It does not just cover one Religion, you will look at all faiths and no faith.

RE does not aim to provide answers to the 'big questions', but simply encourages you to think and challenge your own perspectives.

RE is not an assessed subject. There will be no homework, coursework or exams and there aren't even any desks! The sole purpose is to broaden your horizons and it embodies the respect and aspirations we have for all our students as we strive to educate the whole person.









Cardinal Newman College employs professionally trained careers advisers who have extensive experience supporting young people into Higher Education and employment/ apprenticeships.

The team follow a professional code of conduct, and have achieved The Quality in Careers Standard, ensuring all students receive impartial and confidential support. Cardinal Newman value the importance of careers guidance for young people and work within the Gatsby benchmarks framework to ensure good practice.

WHAT WE DO

The careers team offer 1-1 advice and guidance appointments and this may suit students who are unsure about their career pathway and would like to explore their options, or students who want to discuss their ideas further. All sessions are confidential and the information is only shared between advisers and the student. This service is available to ALL current students or anyone thinking of studying at Cardinal Newman College. Students are also encouraged to email the team or drop in if they have a question that they feel could be resolved quickly. During term time, the careers staff are generally available 8.30am - 4.30pm, Monday - Friday for drop in enquiries, but students can also arrange 1-1 appointments with the careers team via email careers@cardinalnewman.ac.uk

All students also have access to the Careers student share page which contains lots of useful information. links and resources to support with career/progression planning.

CAREERS EDUCATION

All full-time students have access to a programme of careers education throughout their time at Cardinal Newman. Careers staff work closely with pastoral staff to plan careers sessions that include a diverse range of topics relating to careers and employability, as well as provide advice and guidance on higher education programmes including honours degrees, foundation degrees and post graduate opportunities.

Students receive careers education via their curriculum subjects and the careers team support teachers to implement this.



DANCE





ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

HOW MANY SUBJECTS CAN I CHOOSE?

At Newman most of our students study a level 3 Programme, this is at least three A-Levels or BTEC equivalent, with some students studying a maximum of four A-Levels. Our student timetable is flexible which means that many course combinations are possible including mixed programmes where you study A-Levels alongside BTECs. Guidance and advice regarding your subject choices will be given to you during your enrolment appointment.

Those wishing to speak to the College about their chosen subjects can contact the admissions team or have any of your course queries answered by attending one of our open events in the Autumn and Winter term.

CORE MATHS

The Level 3 Certificate in Core Maths is worth the same UCAS points as an AS Level. Objectives of the course include developing confidence in representing and analysing authentic situations mathematically, in addition to building skills in mathematical thinking, reasoning and communication. There is a growing demand for employees with good mathematical understanding, so by studying Core Maths you will be able to boost your skillset, helping to prepare you for your future career.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

The table to the right shows details of the standard College entry requirements. Subject specific requirements may apply and can be found on the College's website. If you wish to progress onto a level 3 BTEC course, a Merit is expected in your BTEC L2 at school, along with five grade 4s at GCSE. If you don't achieve a grade 4 in GCSE Maths and/or English Language you will re-sit these as part of your programme of study.

EPO

The Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) is a free standing qualification. It is half an A-Level and is worth up to 28 UCAS points. You can explore an aspect of a subject you are studying, choose a topic in which you have a personal interest in or do a project about an issue that concerns you.

The project can take many forms but will fall into one of the following:

- An essay
- A report or investigation
- A production (music, drama, dance, film, etc.)
- An artefact (model, painting, machine, etc)
- It can be on any topic of interest within reason
- Usually it is linked to your career or university aspirations but does not have to be.

As long as you can fulfil the assessment requirements of the qualification then it can become an Extended Project.

TRAVEL AND BURSARY

Getting to Cardinal Newman College couldn't be easier, as the College is situated within five minutes' walk from Preston bus station and the city centre and is also within fifteen minutes' walk from the railway station.

Funds can be provided to help towards the cost of travel, meals, books, equipment and essential materials needed for your courses. You must be under 19 on the 31 August in the year in which you start your programme of study to qualify.

T-Levels are the equivalent to studying THREE A-Levels and combine Level 3 study with industry placement across the two years. Designed with employers, T-Levels give young people the skills that are needed to work within industry.

They have been developed in collaboration with employers and businesses to ensure the content prepares learners for the world of work and meets industry needs.

At Newman, our T-Level Placement Officers support you in gaining the right industry placement alongside your course, and with so many more new T-Levels introduced, these courses are the way forward in Technical qualifications.

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COURSES

Our range of BTEC courses includes BTEC Extended Diplomas which are the equivalent to three A-Levels, BTEC Foundation Diplomas which are equivalent to 1.5 A-Levels, BTEC Diplomas which are the equivalent to two A-Levels and BTEC Extended Certificates, which are equivalent to one A-Level.

This means that you can choose to study just one subject if you take a BTEC Extended Diploma, or a combination of subjects if you choose the mixed programme with a Diploma or Extended Certificate alongside A-Levels.

BTECs are Level 3 qualifications with assessment and practical assignments and are completed in two years.

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GCSERE-SIT

If you do not manage to achieve a grade 4 or above in your English or Maths GCSE, you will be asked to resit these alongside another course to make a full programme of study. For example, you may wish to study a BTEC Extended Diploma in Business with a GCSE resit in English alongside it.

GCSE ENGLISH

GCSE English Language involves the essential skills of reading, writing, speaking and listening. A GCSE in English Language is invaluable! Whether you want to go to university, apply for an apprenticeship or a job; employers and universities will insist upon it as a basic requirement.

It is very important to be confident in the use of language because many of the skills required in everyday life draw upon this in order to achieve success. At Newman you can take a resit in English Language alongside a selection of BTEC and A-Level courses dependent on entry requirements.

GCSE MATHS

GCSE Mathematics is essential for your future career prospects and is a qualification which is held in high regard by all employers. It is a valuable qualification and if you are intending to go to university to study at degree level, nearly all university courses require you to have a level 2 qualification in Maths.



ENTRY CRITERIA

A grade 3 or below in GCSE Maths and/or English Language

NOTE: This resit must be taken alongside a full programme of study. It cannot be taken on its own.

LEVEL 2

COURSES

Our Level 2 courses provide students who missed out on achieving five grade 4s at GCSE a chance to boost their qualifications before progressing onto a Level 3 course at Newman.

Upon successful completion of the Level 2 Certificate which is a one year course, you may progress onto a BTEC Level 3 course offered at the College.

FOUNDATION

LEARNING

The Foundation Learning programme focuses on personal and social development and general employability skills, working on areas such as life skills, community access, communication and wellbeing.

You will cover independence in the home and community, developing self, work exploration and work-related experience, health and wellbeing, confidence and communication.

The course aims to progress the independence and communication skills needed in everyday life and work and offers work related experiences, in a managed and supported environment, allowing you to start to gain an awareness of the world of work.

It allows students to develop transferable work and personal skills, which will help them to achieve their aspirations for the future. It also allows students to take time to make decisions about their preferred vocational pathway.

ENTRY CRITERIA

All students will undertake a literacy and numeracy assessment and work within the appropriate levels in order to progress. Accreditation will be pursued where appropriate.

EXPLAINED

The Mixed Programme allows students to combine BTEC and A-Levels to create their perfect programme of study. It is ideal for students who haven't achieved five grade 5s at GCSE, but still have a good set of GCSE results, so they could successfully study one or even two A-Levels alongside a BTEC.

When considering the Mixed Programme, take into consideration how you work best when it comes to your studies. If you find the pressure of exams too much, then a BTEC Extended Diploma (Equivalent to 3 A-Levels) may be best for you.

Results were strong across the board, with 72% of students achieving A*-B at advanced level. This means that 7 out of 10 Newman students achieved A*-B in their Level 3 studies with us, whilst the national picture shows that the average grades for all A-Levels at A*-C is 75.4%. Our results also show that we have smashed the national average with our students achieving a staggering 90% A*-C. We are also delighted with the results for our Science and Maths subjects, in particular Maths, where 88% of our A-Level Maths students achieved grades A*-B compared to 62% nationally.

In reality, what this means is that if you choose Cardinal Newman for your post 16 education, your chances of success are fantastic. It's important to us that our students feel happy, supported and are enjoying their studies. If they are happy and enjoying their work, they will achieve much better grades as a result.
